## 88 Columbus Students Earn AP Scholar Honors



Columbus High School was recently notified by the College Board's Advanced Placement Program that 88 students have been named Advanced Placement Scholars in recognition of their exceptional achievement on the college-level advanced placement exams that were given in May, 2008.

**45** students qualified for the **AP Scholar with Distinction Award** (Received an average grade of 3.5 on all AP Exams taken and grades of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams).

**17** students qualified for the **AP Scholar with Honor Award** (Received an average grade of 3.25 on all AP Exams taken and grades of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams).

**24** students qualified for the **AP Scholar Award** (Received a grade of 3 or higher on three or more exams).

**2** students qualified for the **National AP Scholar Award** (Received an average grade of at least 4 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams).

### **More on the AP Story:**

572 tests were given with 77% of the students scoring 3 and above. In simple terms, 4 out of every 5 students that took an AP Exam passed with a 3 or higher.
